TOURNAMENT FORMAT & RULES

The decision of the Tournament Committee in all matters relating to the tournament is final.

- Maximum handicap for the tournament is 20 (playing and course).
- Competitors should report to the desk at least 20 minutes before their tee-off time each time they are playing
- **All players must enter their score on completion of rounds** using the screen in the locker rooms corridor or in the main lounge, excluding those playing in Match Play. Scorecards to be put in box under lounge screen.
- **A sweep for Twos** will be held for the 2 qualifying rounds – entry optional, cost £2 to be paid when checking in
-

All competitors will play two qualifying rounds, one on Monday and one on Tuesday, the tee times will be the same on both days. In the event of loss of qualifying days due to bad weather, qualifying will be extended to Wednesday with the number of qualifiers in each section reduced as required.

- **The 2 qualifying rounds will be based on Playing Handicap** (handicap allowance 95%, as per Scottish Golf).
- The sections will be - 5 to 11 and 12 to 20.
- The leading 32 aggregate scores in each section (scratch, low & high handicap) will proceed to match play. Whatever section you play in for qualifying, you remain in for matchplay.
- In all match play ties, **full difference of Course Handicap** will apply (course handicap not to exceed section maximum).
-

The match play draws will take place in the Clubhouse **at approximately 10.00 pm Tuesday evening**

Any player who knows he will be unable to compete in the Matchplay must put his name on the notice on the board in the foyer no later than 8.00 pm on Tuesday.

All non-qualifiers from the qualifying rounds will automatically be entered into the consolation Stableford on Wednesday unless they write on the notice on the foyer notice board that they do not wish to play. The draw will be posted after the match play draw.

All non-qualifiers together with those defeated in the first round of match play may enter the consolation competition on Thursday (3 Ball Texas Scramble). **Note:** Those beaten in Thursday morning match play are **not** eligible to play in the consolation in the afternoon.

Entry sheets will be posted on Wednesday morning from 10.00 am. Choose own tee time.

A two-ball foursomes will be played on Friday between 9.00 a.m. and 12 noon. The entry sheet will be posted at 10.00 a.m. on Thursday. Choose own tee time.

During the match play stages all match play ties will take priority. The Committee will make every effort to keep to schedule but cannot accept responsibility for delays in consolation competitions.

Handicap revision will take place as follows:

Handicaps will be revised automatically each day. Any changes will apply for subsequent rounds. Aggregate of qualifying rounds will be based on Round 1 handicap.

ROBOTS

Duff House Royal would like to introduce players this week to the newest members of the greenkeeping team, our Husqvarna robots (see picture below). You will see these on the course from time to time before, during and after play.



LOCAL RULES and ADVICE RECEIVED from the R. & A

Q – What do you do if your ball is run over?

A – Mark and replace ball to the nearest point of relief without penalty (its original position)

Q – What is the consequence of hitting a mower (ball going out of bounds etc)?

A – Ball should be played where it comes to rest or replayed under usual penalty if out of bounds

Q – How are the GPS masts treated?

A – These are marked as GUR - Free relief may be taken if the mast is interfering with your swing but no relief will be given for line of sight.

Q – What to do if my ball is in the docking station area at right of 8th tee?

A – This area is marked/classed as GUR. **Note** - The docking station located in the practice area is within the existing out of bounds area. No change.

Note:-

Mower cable trench down left of 15 has now been repaired and relief is no longer available. Exception will be within the white lines which are clearly visible near 6th green.

Bunker Rakes:-

Please replace all bunker rakes inside the bunkers after use as the robots can become beached. Please report any stranded robots however the greenstaff should be notified by mobile phone notification directly from the robots.

LIGHTNING

It can be extremely scary being caught far from the Clubhouse when a thunderstorm strikes. Here are some tips on how to minimise the danger:

1. BE AWARE—Be alert to the signs of changing weather, such as darkening skies, a sudden wind shift or drop in temperature. **Do not ignore instructions to get to safety.**

2. PLAN AHEAD—Plan your evacuation and safety measures in advance. Lightning often precedes rain, so do not wait for the rain to begin before suspending activities.

3. SEEK SAFETY—Use the 30-30 rule: at the very latest, seek safety when thunder and lightning are separated by 30 seconds (when the storm will be 5-6 miles away), and do not resume activities for 30 minutes after the last observed lightning or thunder (when the storm has passed 10-15 miles away).

4. IF CAUGHT OUTDOORS - Avoid water. Avoid high ground. Avoid open spaces. Put down your Clubs, and avoid contact with anything that contains metal, including golf bags, golf carts, umbrellas, electric wires or fences. Open golf carts do not afford safety.

5. AVOID TREES—Do not stand underneath a natural lightning rod such as an isolated tree. Move away from any tree to a distance that is twice the height of the tree.

6. IF LIGHTNING IS STRIKING NEARBY when you are outside, you should:

- Crouch down with your feet together. **Do not lie down.**
- Place your hands over ears to minimise hearing damage from thunder.
- Avoid proximity to other people - keep at least 15 feet apart.
- Do not huddle together.
